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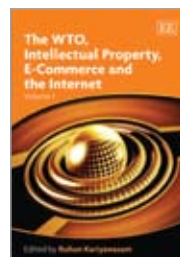
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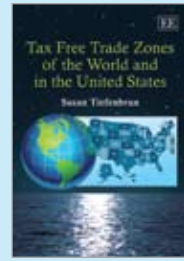
Tax Free Trade Zones of the World and in the United States

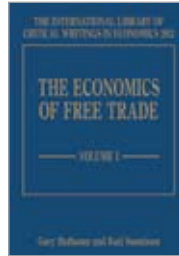

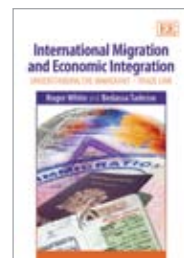
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International Migration and Economic Integration

The operability of the link is found to depend on a variety of factors related to immigrants' home countries, their host countries, the types of goods and services being traded and the anthropogenic characteristics of the immigrants themselves.

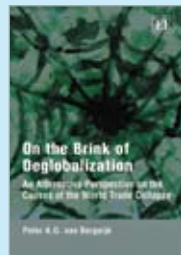
An Alternative Perspective on the Causes of the World Trade Collapse
